The Night Before... Week 2: Hopeless in Jerusalem

Welcome to Week #2 of our Christmas devotional that accompanies *The Night Before* sermon series. Last week we took time to look for Jesus and to look out for those around us. This week we tackle the idea of silence and embracing it instead of fighting it. Have you ever noticed that when you're talking with someone and there's a lull in conversation, things get awkward? We look at silence as such a bad thing that we can't help but fill it with something. So we talk, turn on music, look at our phone, call someone, or find any other thing to fill the void. But what if God wanted to use that silence? What if in the silence God spoke the loudest? This week let's wrestle with this idea of Godly silence. Again, take time to read the passage, consider the questions, and then see how you can do something with what you've read this week.

Read:

James 3:1-12

Consider:

- What are your greatest fears or insecurities about silence?
- Speaking is usually the greatest enemy to silence. James writes here about the difficulty in taming our tongue in life. What are the greatest triggers for you that cause your tongue to become wild?
- What does not speaking into a situation allow you to do spiritually? List as many as you can.
- When we don't speak, we are forced to listen more. How can listening increase your relationship with God?
- We've all heard the phrase, "less is more", but how can that apply to our interactions with others? What does silence allow when you do speak to others?

Act:

One of the greatest things about Jesus was not always in what He said, but sometimes in what He did not say. Peter said about Jesus that, "When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly." (1 Peter 3:23) Jesus often would withdraw and pray and listen for God's voice in His ministry (Luke 5:16). When He was in the Garden of Gethsemane, He listened for the Father's voice in His greatest time of need. (Matthew 26:42) So if Jesus made a habit of resting in the silence of God, then so should we. We should find comfort in knowing He is still there even if He's not speaking. And when we do speak, we should speak out of a heart that has listened well to what the Father has told us in silence.

The entire Crossroads office staff recently toured the facility at Gospel Center Rescue Mission in Stockton, and they've asked if we would provide warm clothing for men in their care. We are asking for only new clothing, sizes M, L and XL, suggested in black, navy and grey, sweat shirts or gloves, and socks or "throw" blankets. We hope to serve 200 men. Drop off deadline: Sun Dec 18th.
