Welcome to the weekly devotion to the “The Night Before” Series. Each devotion is meant for you to dig in more after the message and prepare your hearts further for Christmas. For this week’s devotion, let’s continue by looking at this idea of being unaware. All of us are unaware about a lot of things, just ask any wife trying to talk to her husband watching football on TV. As hard as we may try sometimes, we miss things that are right in front of us even if they are good and Godly things. So how can we miss less of these moments? To illustrate this, I want to take us out of the Christmas story for a second and actually look at a time after Jesus had resurrected. Take the time to consider these questions on your own this week or around the dinner table.

Read:

Luke 24:13-25

Consider:

What were the factors that kept these men from recognizing Jesus? Were they avoidable?

These men were followers of Jesus yet didn’t recognize Him. How is it possible to say you know Christ and still not be able to see Him?

Jesus did several things to show himself to these men. He walked with them, ate with them, and shared the Bible with them. Of these three, which one would best help you become more aware of Jesus in your life? In other words, do you connect with Jesus through actions, fellowship, or academic?

Unawareness is usually a product of being distracted, inattentive, or lazy. Of these three, which is most likely to cause you to become unaware to what God has for you in your life?

Act:

The Bible says that these men’s hearts began to burn within them as Jesus talked to them about the Bible. This was more than heartburn, but more of an excitement about what they had learned with a desire to know more. It also caused them to do something with what they heard as they went directly back to Jerusalem where they should have been all along This week, take time to read your Bible and become aware of what God’s desires are. Consider reading all of Luke 24 and also Luke 10:25-37. Then take the next step and act on what God is calling you to do. Don’t wait for someone else to do something when you can do it. Allow yourself to become more aware of God than ever before this Christmas, and see how your life comes alive and how your heart burns within you too.

Turkey Bowl on Thanksgiving morning:

The Gospel was clearly shared at Half Time as our primary goal for this outreach. 459 players, 40 teams, 20 fields, 44 refs, 67 volunteers, \$1441 to Love INC, a few minor injuries, one Lord Jesus, no fights—Great day!

Opportunity: Christmas Presents Outreach

We have 16 families from a local grade school or a shelter to provide Christmas presents for their children (but to be given from the parents), and warm clothing for 200 men at Gospel Center Rescue Mission in Stockton.

The entire Crossroads office staff recently toured the facility at Gospel Center Rescue Mission in Stockton, and they've asked if we would provide warm clothing for men in their care. We are asking for only new clothing, sizes M, L and XL, suggested in black, navy and grey, sweat shirts or gloves, and socks or "throw" blankets. We hope to serve 200 men. Drop off deadline: Sun Dec 18th.

Stop along the way this Christmas season to engage a few strangers in simple conversations, and then ask them how you could pray for them. Simple presence, not presents.
